There is Need of Only One Thing

We all have "Martha moments" and "Mary moments," no matter what our state in life or the constellation of our responsibilities—situations where sometimes the call to action is primary and other situations where a need to take a step back, pray and discern, talk over things with others as we navigate our way forward.

There is significance in the placement of the Martha and Mary passage in Luke. Right before it comes the parable of the Good Samaritan, the ultimate story of discipleship as service, sharing the mercy of Christ with those around us.

Right after the Martha and Mary story, Jesus receives a different kind of question. His disciples come to him and say: "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." What follows after that are the words that have come to be known as the Lord's Prayer. The sisters of service and contemplation are sandwiched right in between passages that emphasize the importance of both. Martha and Mary. Both sisters are integral to a faithful life.

There is a need for only one thing. Jesus doesn't say explicitly what that one thing is. He leaves it hanging. Mary was on her way to finding it while Martha was distracted from it, but one gets the sense that the one thing can be present whether one is sitting at the feet of the sage or engaged in service in the kitchen, or wherever one finds oneself.
